he Japan Studies Institute (JSI) allows faculty without prior experience in Japanese studies to learn from scholars, business leaders, artists and journalists about Japan, both past and present. The institute encourages participants to develop strategies for incorporating Japanese studies into courses on their campuses. The institute is multidisciplinary in approach and introduces participants to a comprehensive range of teaching and learning resources related to the study of modern Japan.

SPONSORS

The JSI fellowships and institute are made possible by a generous endowment from the Nippon Foundation. The American Association of State Colleges and Universities (AASCU) manages the fellowships; San Diego State University provides the academic program and facilities.

PARTICIPANTS

Participants must be full-time faculty or administrators at AASCU member institutions with the potential to impact undergraduate education and have no prior training or professional experience in Japanese studies.

FELLOWSHIPS

Fellowships include administrative and academic costs and campus housing. Participants receive up to \$700 for transportation and a \$700 stipend for meals and other expenses. Institutions whose faculty are accepted for the fellowships pay a partial tuition of \$700. The total value of this program is \$5,500 per person.
