What are cognates?

- •Cognates are words in two languages that have the same or similarly spellings and pronunciations.
- English and Japanese share more than 20,000 cognates.
- •Teachers can teach English-Japanese cognates to help Japanese English learners learn new English vocabulary words and help American English-only students learn Japanese.

Note

It is important to point out that the Romaji versions of the Japanese words are derived from the English versions. However, the words are usually spelled in the Japanese Katakana alphabet. As such, Japanese words have their own unique pronunciations. It is advisable that Japanese language learners ask Japanese speakers to model pronunciation of new words.

To view English/Japanese cognates, go to <u>Google translate</u> or Yahoo's <u>Babel Fish</u> website. Input the English version, then select translate from English to Japanese.
